Come, let us bow down in worship;
let us kneel before the LORD who made us.


— *Psalm 95:6*

FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God’s very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God’s mouth. In Mark’s Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God’s own voice, the Holy One of God.

The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today’s Gospel we learn that Jesus’ fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn’t an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God’s purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God’s very words filling our mouths.

TO BLESS OR NOT TO BLESS



As priests we are asked to bless homes, business places, sacred objects and above all, people. In my ministry, I have asked for blessings from companions and especially from holy people who are dying. A blessing that I loved to get was from my aunt who lived in our ancestral home. She would always run inside, get Holy Water and sprinkle me saying "A special blessing from your mother (R.I.P.), your grandparents and all who have ever lived here, In the name of the Father, in the name of the Son, and in the name of the Holy Ghost, Amen." I always drove away knowing that she and my uncle were saying the rosary for me that evening, and that I was praying for them and please God, we would meet again.

The source from whom every good gift comes is God, who is above all, Blessed forever. He who is all good has made all things good, so that He might fill His creatures with blessings. Even after the fall of mankind, He continued His blessings as a sign of His merciful Love. In the fullness of time, God the Father sent His only Son, and through Him there is a new gift in every spiritual blessing. After His Death, Resurrection and Ascension, Christ sent the gift of the Holy Spirit on those called to new life. As members of Christ's Body, we are to spread the fruits of the same spirit in order to bring God's healing blessings to the world. "For well disposed members of the faithful, the liturgy of Sacramental's sanctifies almost every event of their lives with the Divine Grace which flows from the Paschal mystery. From this source all Sacraments and Sacramental's draw their power. There is scarcely any proper use of material things which cannot be thus directed toward the sanctification of people and the praise of God. (Catechism—1670). The Church also asks that the celebration of the blessing of things or places according to custom, should not take place without the participation of at least some of the faithful.

As priests, we bless homes, automobiles, places of business, sacred objects and people, where time permits. It is a beautiful reminder to us that God blesses us and that all things can sanctify and give glory to God.
